# Lasting Impacts of Child Poverty

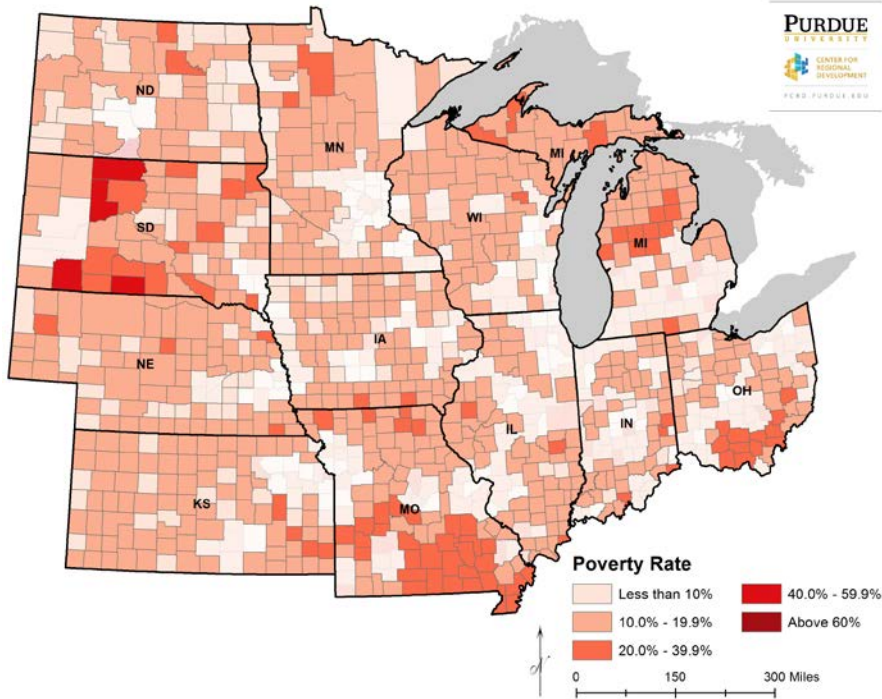
- Childhood Disadvantage is Associated with ...  
More ***Health Risks*** and More ***Problems in Social Functions***
  - Lower educational attainment
  - Reduced friend support
  - Lower social integration
  - Higher incidence of smoking
  - Increased family strain
  - More health problems



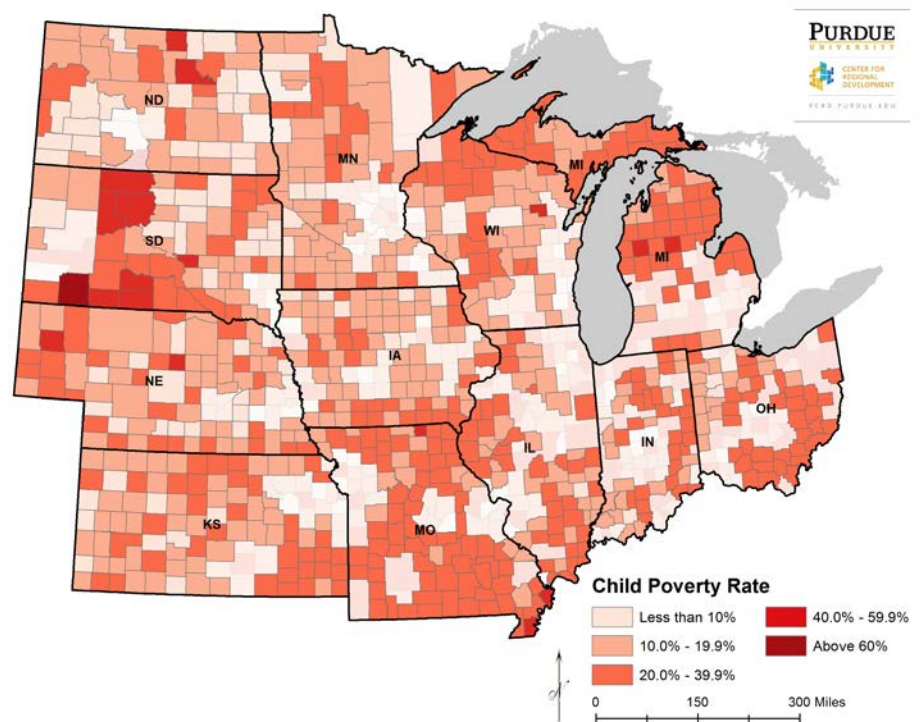

Total Population in Poverty	10.4%	12.4%	14.9%
Minors (Age 0-17) in Poverty	14.4%	16.8%	20.4%
Real Median Household Income* (\$ 2013)	\$55,748	\$ 54,563	\$51,138

  - Family (Parenting, Structure, Investments, etc.)
  - Community (Education, Safety, Jobs, etc.)

## Programs Need to Be (Holistic and Begin with Capacity Building)

 Community/Region: Economic Opportunity, Support, Education, Capacity Building, etc. 

 Families: Parenting, Structure, Career Readiness, Life Skills, etc. 

 Child/Youth: Education, Career Readiness, Life Skills, Leadership, Social Integration, etc.
