Transportation challenges topic for Farm Foundation® Forum

OAK BROOK, IL Nov. 12, 2014: When a new Congress convenes in January, transportation funding will be on the agenda. How the nation's rural transportation infrastructure may fare in those legislative discussions is one of the topics that may arise when the Farm Foundation[®] Forum examines *Transportation Challenges in Agriculture*.

The Forum will be 9 a.m. to 11 a.m. EST on Wednesday, Nov. 19, at the National Press Club, 529 14th St., NW, Washington D.C. A live audiocast will be available free of charge for those unable to attend in person.

The availability of rail cars to move this year's grain harvest has been a frequent news item, yet rail service is only one of many transportation issues facing agriculture and rural America today. Federal, state and county maintenance and replacement budgets are not keeping pace with the changing demands on the nation's aging road, bridge and waterway infrastructure.

To provide perspectives for discussion, the Forum will begin with presentations by:

- John H. Miller, Group Vice President, Agricultural Products, BNSF Railroad;
- Mike Steenhoek, Executive Director, Soy Transportation Coalition; and
- Jon Samson, Executive Director of the American Trucking Associations' Agriculture and Food Transporters Conference.

Moderating the session will be grain farmer Mark Scholl of J&M Scholl, Inc. Mr. Scholl and Mr. Miller are both Trustees of Farm Foundation.

There is no charge to participate in the Forum or the live audiocast, but registration is requested.
