






Areas with Greatest Need

A comprehensive, multi-faceted \$120 million financing pool

Funds fresh food retail projects in underserved areas

How may supermarkets use these funds?



- Grant funding up to \$250,000 per store
- Loan funding up to \$2.5 million per store




Fresh Food Financing Initiative
